### What is idea?

 A plan, thought or suggestion, especially about what to do in a particular situation




- Example: **Phenol** (carbolic acid) was discovered in 1834 by Friedlieb Ferdinand Runge, who extracted it (in impure form) from coal tar.
- In 1860 Küchenmeister first used phenol as a wound dressing in Germany.
- Sir Joseph Lister in his pioneering technique of **antiseptic** surgery used phenol in 1864.
- antiseptic surgery began winning acceptance around 1876.

- carbolic acid causes irritation to living tissues. For this reason it has been replaced by newer, safer antiseptic compounds.
- **IDEA!** In 1894, William Lever, introduced the first mass-produced carbolic soap to the market, Lifebuoy.
- So surplus production capacity available, IDEA!
   When mixed with reagents, phenol can be an effective disinfectant for toilets, stables, floors and drains. Now widely used as disinfectent.
- **IDEA!** Snakes can absorb liquids through their skin, carbolic acid is used to prevent snake infestation in rural india.

### INNOVATION

 An idea that has been transformed into practical reality.....through new product, concept, process, combinations...... Is called





- In 13th century, those with hearing loss were using hollowed out horns of animals such as cows and rams as primitive hearing devices.
- In 18th century "modern" ear trumpet was invented.
- The first electric hearing aid was invented in 1898 by Miller Reese Hutchison. His design used an electric current to amplify weak signals. INVENTION!
- Hutchison's interest in the invention stemmed from a childhood friend, who was deaf from scarlet fever.
- In 1913, the world was introduced to the first commercially manufactured hearing aids.



### Incubation

- A business incubator is a company that helps new and start-up companies to develop by providing services such as management training or office space.
- Their goal is to help create and grow young businesses by providing them with necessary support

- Example: <a href="https://qure.ai/">https://qure.ai/</a> builds deep learning solutions that aid physicians with routine diagnosis and treatment, allowing them to spend more time with patients.
- Founder Pooja Rao a doctor (who is also R & D head). Co-founder Prashant Warier (who is also CEO)
- <a href="https://qure.ai/">https://qure.ai/</a> is \$500Million worth now

- Prathap Chandra Reddy is an Indian entrepreneur and cardiologist who founded the first corporate chain of hospitals in India.
- Dr. Agarwal's Eye Hospital was founded by Jaiveer Agarwal with his wife Tahira Agarwal in Chennai, started as an eye care centre which has grown to more than 75+ centres in India and 14 centres overseas.
